Re: **Implementation of Mandatory Electronic Filing in Supreme Court:  
Cayuga and Yates Counties**

I am pleased to provide the Bar and other interested persons with an update on the progress of the New York State Courts' Electronic Filing System ("NYSCEF"). The District Administrative Judge of the 7<sup>th</sup> Judicial District has proposed the implementation of a mandatory e-filing program in the Supreme Court in Cayuga and Yates Counties, **to take effect February 1, 2021**. The County Clerk of each County has joined in this request. To date, the 7<sup>th</sup> Judicial District has successfully implemented e-filing programs in the Supreme Court in all counties within the District, including mandatory e-filing programs in Livingston, Monroe, Ontario, and Wayne Counties.

As of the effective date, the authorization will be to implement a mandatory e-filing program in the Supreme Court of Cayuga and Yates Counties to include **all new civil actions, except:**

- CPLR Art. 70 proceedings
- CPLR Art. 78 proceedings
- Election Law proceedings
- matrimonial matters
- Mental Hygiene Law matters
- consumer credit transactions as defined in CPLR 105(f)\*
- residential foreclosure actions as defined in RPAPL 1304\*  
(\*except initial filing of commencement papers by a represented party, which is mandatory)

They have additionally proposed to modify the existing consensual e-filing programs in each court to include the case types listed above that are not subject to mandatory e-filing, and to include the consensual e-filing of documents filed subsequent to commencement papers in consumer credit transactions and residential foreclosure actions.

Attorneys, paralegals and interested filers may register on-line for upcoming sessions.

Please note that by legislation and statute all unrepresented parties are automatically exempt from participating in e-filing in any case. However, unrepresented parties may choose to e-file. Information on how to do so is available at <http://www.nycourts.gov/efile-unrepresented>. Attorneys who certify in good faith that they lack requisite hardware, electronic connection or technical knowledge to participate in e-filing, may opt out of e-filing.

E-filing represents an important and necessary advance for the courts and the legal profession in New York State, and continues to be invaluable as we tackle the challenges created by the current public health emergency. We thank you for the wonderful support and cooperation you have shown and look forward to continuing to work closely with you as the program continues to move forward.
