Implementation of Mandatory Electronic Filing in Supreme Court:

Greene and Schoharie Counties

I am pleased to provide the Bar and other interested persons with an update on the progress of the New York State Courts' Electronic Filing System ("NYSCEF"). The District Administrative Judge of the 3rd Judicial District has proposed the implementation of a mandatory e-filing program in the Supreme Court in both Greene and Schoharie Counties. The County Clerk of each County has joined in this request. To date, the 3rd Judicial District has successfully implemented e-filing programs in the Supreme Court in nearly all counties within the District, including mandatory e-filing programs in Albany, Columbia, Rensselaer, Sullivan and Ulster Counties. The implementation of mandatory e-filing in these courts to take effect October 21, 2020, will result in <u>all</u> counties within the 3rd Judicial District with authorized e-filing programs for civil matters in the Supreme Court.

As of the effective date, the authorization will be to implement a mandatory e-filing program in the Supreme Court of Green and Schoharie Counties to include **all new civil actions**, **except:**

- CPLR Art. 70 proceedings
- CPLR Art. 78 proceedings
- Election Law proceedings
- matrimonial matters
- Mental Hygiene Law matters
- consumer credit transactions as defined in CPLR 105(f)*
- residential foreclosure actions as defined in RPAPL 1304*
 (*except initial filing of commencement papers by a represented party, which is mandatory)

They have additionally proposed the implementation of a consensual e-filing program in each court to include the case types listed above that are not subject to mandatory e-filing, and to also include the consensual e-filing of documents filed subsequent to commencement papers in consumer credit transactions and residential foreclosure actions.

Persons wishing to comment on this proposal should e-mail their submissions to efilingcomments@nycourts.gov no later than October 15, 2020. A new page has been created on the Unified Court System's website - www.nycourts.gov/rules/efiling/ - to provide notice to the public of proposed new or expanded mandatory e-filing programs and for posting any public comments received on such proposals. Attorneys, paralegals and interested filers may register on-line for upcoming training sessions.

Please note that by legislation and statue all unrepresented parties are automatically exempt from participating in e-filing in any case. However, unrepresented parties may choose to e-file. Information on how to do so is available at http://www.nycourts.gov/efile-unrepresented. Attorneys who certify in good faith that they lack requisite hardware, electronic connection or technical knowledge to participate in e-filing, may opt out of e-filing.

E-filing represents an important and necessary advance for the courts and the legal profession in New York State. We thank you for the wonderful support and cooperation you have shown and look forward to continuing to work closely with you as the program continues to move forward.
